During the financial year ended 31 March 2021, this authority's internal auditor acting independently and on the basis of an assessment of risk, carried out a selective assessment of compliance with the relevant procedures and controls in operation and obtained appropriate evidence from the authority.

Internal Auditor note on test N:

In order to test compliance with the Council's requirement for the exercise of public rights, I checked to see that the authority complied with the publication requirements for the AGAR 2019/20. Before 01/09/20, the Council was required to publish ss1&2 of the 2019/20 AGAR (the Annual Governance Statement and accounts), along with the public rights notice and a note that the AGAR was unaudited. It published this information within deadline.

The 2020/21 AGAR introduced an additional element of the test, which required internal auditors to also check that the Council published the notice of conclusion of audit, and ss1-3 of the AGAR (including the external audit report) once the external audit was completed and before the deadline of 30/11/20. As this was not notified to internal auditors until the return was published in March 2021, I was unable to complete the test at the time of the publication. I checked the Council's website on 16/04/21 and confirmed that the notice of conclusion of audit had been published on 24/08/20 (within deadline), but that s.3 (the external audit report), had not been published. The Clerk has confirmed that this will be added as soon as possible.

I have, therefore, responded 'no' on this test.
